# Livestock Shows General Guidelines and Rules

- 1. All exhibitors must abide by the General Here's The Beef (HTB) Festival Rules.
- 2. All livestock must be cared for by owner. All animals must be kept in assigned stalls or location and be always under control of exhibitor.
- 3. Exhibitor removing stock from grounds before release time, will forfeit all awards including premiums.
- 4. Exhibitors will be required to keep assigned space clean and sanitary by removing litter to place provided for disposal.
- 5. Exhibitors must furnish their own feed and equipment, including bedding.
- 6. <u>Entry forms</u> for each show are <u>online</u>. The links are within each show's guidelines.
- Make your <u>check payable to</u> Pulaski Lions Club and <u>mail entry</u> fees to Pulaski Lions Club c/o Benny Birdsong 505 Morrow Ln., Pulaski, TN 38478. Remember that all livestock exhibitors are required to pre-enter/register their livestock by Wednesday, August 31 (of current year) by 4:30pm. Otherwise, late fees apply.
- 8. **Fees** (non-refundable) are located within the specific guidelines for each livestock show and MUST accompany entry forms.
- 9. Barn space will be assigned for entries received by August 31, 2022.
- 10. All entries for livestock must be legibly written on regular entry forms and identify specific show in which participating. Entries are to be made in name shown on registration papers. During participation in any Giles Livestock Show, attendants at each exhibit must have in their possession all necessary health certificates and proper breed association registration paperwork. Tennessee Department of Agriculture will enforce animal tattoos by cross-referencing with health and registration paperwork.
- 11. See individual show guidelines for check-in and release times. No tack, supplies, or animals accepted in exhibition barns until time and date shown in guidelines for individual shows.
- 12. Name, birth date, breed, and registration number of each animal must be given on entry blanks at time of entry.
- 13. Exhibitor must show livestock in designated age classification, no exceptions.
- 14. All exhibitors must wear show numbers provided at registration time while exhibiting their animals.
- 15. Every animal upon exhibition shall be under the control of the management and while every reasonable precaution will be taken for the safeguarding of same, neither the management, it's officers nor agents with the festival will be liable as warehouser of property of the exhibitor.
- 16. An exhibitor is the owner as shown on registration certificate.
- 17. All trucks and trailers must be parked in special livestock parking areas.
- 18. When entries exceed stall or pen facilities, animals will be accepted according to the date entries are received. <u>Stall and pen facilities will be designated after the entry deadline.</u>
- 19. Any livestock exhibitor that does not present their entry into show ring will forfeit any prize money in that class.
- 20. All **<u>iudges</u>** to be determined at time of each show.

Entry dates:	NO animals will be permitted on festival premises until the morning of the show. Admission time is 11:00am to 1:00pm day of show (Thursday, September 8 <sup>th</sup> ). All animals must be on the festival grounds and checked in by 1:00pm. <i>Tack and supplies</i> may be brought in, and exhibit set up in assigned stall is anytime between 3:00pm and 9:00pm the day prior to show (Wednesday, September 7 <sup>th</sup> ). Any exhibitor or owner failing to adhere to any rule stated herein is subject to forfeiture of all awards and not being invited to future shows. Stall assignments will be made the day prior to the show.
Rules and Regulations	See Livestock General Guidelines and Rules and Rules Specific to Beef Show, below.
Show Time:	Thursday, September 8 <sup>th</sup> at 3:00pm, begins with Pee Wee Showmanship (open to any youth of pre-4-H age (3 <sup>rd</sup> grade and under).
Breed classes:	Black Angus, Hereford, All other breeds, and Commercial Heifer. Classes will rotate through breeds. Show order will be announced prior to show.
Release time:	Following completion of the show, NO early dismissals.
Health Requirements:	Health requirements must conform to Tennessee State Health Requirements. Each animal must be included on the health paperwork. All juniors must have health paperwork for their beef animals. No beef animals showing active signs on ringworm or warts will be permitted to show. Refer to governing regulations for additional information. Tennessee Department of Agriculture will have a representative present during entry times to check health paperwork.

# **General Rules Specific to Beef Show**

• Exhibitor's name must be on registration papers. To be eligible for the junior show, registration paper's must be in the name of the junior and the junior must be in 4<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade as of January 1, 2022.

- Pre-registration entries *must* be checked against certificate of registration in Livestock by 1pm. Late registration should be approved by Superintendent.
- All animals, other than commercial heifers, must be shown at halter in their respective breed class.
- All animals must be halter broke and no animal may be exhibited in competition that cannot be properly managed and led into the show-ring <u>by exhibitor</u>. Show judge and Livestock Committee have the right to dismiss any unruly animals.
- All animals must have registration papers except animals born on or after January 1, 2022. No exceptions granted. However, commercial heifers will also be required to have health paperwork.
- Animals must show in their age class. NO EXCEPTIONS!
- The Here's the Beef Festival will not guarantee any breed shows in 2023 for those not having at least 4 exhibitors and 12 head of cattle in 2021 breed show.
- No bulls will be shown in the 2022 Beef Show.
- If barn spaces are assigned, the exhibitor must use the assigned spaces to be eligible to show. Notify the superintendent in advance of show day with any special requests.
- Premiums for junior classes will only be paid if a junior exhibits the entry. Juniors must show their own entry unless they have more than one entry in classes.
- Exhibitor removing stock from grounds before release time will forfeit all awards including premiums.

Entry dates:	NO sheep will be permitted on festival premises until the morning of the show. Sheep will be admitted from 11:00am to 2:00pm for the show on Tuesday, September 6, 2022. All animals must be on grounds and checked in by 2:00pm. Show begins at 4:00pm. <u>Bedding is not provided</u> , <u>and straw is not permitted</u> . Any exhibitor or owner failing to adhere to any rule stated herein is subject to forfeiture of all awards and not being invited to 2023 show.
Rules and Regulations:	See Livestock General Guidelines and Rules and Rules Specific to Open Sheep Show and Junior Market Lamb & Commercial Ewe Show, below.
Show time:	Tuesday, September 6 <sup>th</sup> at 4:00pm. The sheep show will begin with Pee Wee Showmanship- Open to any youth of pre-4-H age. Jr. Market Lamb & Commercial Ewe Show will begin immediately, following conclusion of Open Sheep Show.
Breed Classes:	Show order will be announced prior to the show. Breeds include Southdown, Shropshire, Katahdin, all other wool breeds, and all other meat breeds. Additional breeds may be added day of show based on exhibitors and number of head.
Release time:	Following completion of all shows. Any exhibitor leaving prior to the completion of the show will forfeit any premiums won.
Health Requirements:	Health requirements must conform to the Tennessee State Health Requirements. Each animal must be included on the health paperwork. All participants must have health paperwork for each animal. Any animal showing clinical signs of contagious disease will be sent home immediately. Refer to governing regulations for additional information.

# General Rules Specific to both <u>Open Sheep Show</u> and \*<u>Jr. Market Lamb &</u> <u>Commercial Ewe Show</u> (Junior only)

- Pre-registration entries *must* be checked against certificate of registration in Show Barn by 2:00pm. Late entries should be approved by Superintendent.
- All animals in exhibit must be shown under control or with halter in their respective breed class.
- All animals must be broken to lead, and no animal may be exhibited in competition that cannot be properly managed. Show judge and Livestock Committee have the right to dismiss any unruly animals.
- All animals must have registration paperwork. No exceptions granted.
- There is no limit on the number of registered breeding ewes an exhibitor can show. However, an exhibitor may show no more than two (2) registered head per age classification.
- Sheep will show in their age classes only, <u>NO EXCEPTIONS</u>.
- Here's the Beef Festival will not guarantee any breed shows in 2023 for those not having at least 3 exhibitors and 12 head of sheep in 2022 breed show.
- Group class entries must be made during registration.
- If barn spaces are assigned, the exhibitor must use the assigned spaces to be eligible to show. Notify the superintendents in advance of show day with any special requests.
- Showmanship class includes Open Sheep, Market Lambs, and Commercial Ewes.
- \*Market Lambs and Commercial Ewes must be exhibited by a Junior. A Junior is considered any youth old enough to show without help.
- \*Exhibitors can show no more than 3 Market Lambs and 3 Commercial Ewes.
- \*All Commercial Ewes and Market Lambs must be weighed on grounds and only once and must have scrapie tags and current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
  - a. Commercial Ewes:
    - i. Open to non-registered yearling ewes and ewe lambs of any breed or combination of breeds.
    - ii. Ewe lambs must have milk teeth and yearlings must have no more than 4 permanent teeth.
    - Ewes will be weighed and divided into classes by weight and by age (lambs & yearlings). Classes will be determined by number of heads entered into the show and after all ewes have been weighed and checked in.
    - iv. Ewe lambs shown as Commercial Ewes cannot show as Market Lambs.
  - b. Market Lambs:
    - i. Market Lambs may be either wether or ewe lambs and must have milk teeth.
    - ii. Ewes shown in the Market Lamb division are not eligible to show in the Commercial Ewe Show.
    - iii. Lambs will be weighed and divided into classes by weight. Classes will be based on number of heads entered in the show and determined after all lambs have been weighed and checked in.

- All animals must be broken, to lead. NO animal may be exhibited in competition that cannot properly be managed.
- The Here's the Beef Festival will not guarantee any breed shows in 2023 for those not having at least 4 exhibitors and 12 head of cattle in 2021 breed show.
- All dairy cattle should be pre-registered and registration fee will increase after August 31<sup>st</sup>.
- Senior Yearlings in milk will show in class 10.
