Master Beef Producer Program

The Tennessee Master Beef Producer (TNMBP) program will begin September 22, 2022, at 5pm in Spring Hill (Middle TN Research and Education Center)! Registration is open! Follow this link: https://tiny.utk.edu/mbp to register. Cost is \$100/producer or \$150/couple (includes one certification, extra cost covers food and snacks). Registration cost includes one certification, cap, sign, manual (first timers), educational materials, snacks, and meals. Link for payment of fees will be available at the end of registration. Fees are due at time of registration. Up to date BQA (Beef Quality Assurance) required for certification.

The program begins September 22 at the Middle Tennessee Research and Education Center (MTREC) in Spring Hill at 5pm. Participants have a choice of September 22-24 (all three days at MTREC) or the night class schedule of September 22 & 29 and October 6 & 13 (rotates between Giles, Lawrence, and Maury Counties). Psst...Just Chick'n In!!!

Did you know the chicken is a descendant of the T-Rex? All thanks to a study of a tiny bit of really, old (68-million-year-old to be exact) slivers of proteins from a Tyrannosaurus rex (T. rex) that, luckily, had not fully fossilized. "The scraps of dinosaur protein were wrested from a fossil femur discovered in 2003 by John Horner of the Museum of the Rockies in a barren fossil-rich stretch of land that spans Wyoming and Montana. Mary H. Schweitzer of North Carolina State University (NCSU) and the North Carolina Museum of Natural Sciences discovered soft-tissue preservation in the T. rex bone in 2005." (Bradt) The T. rex femur was so big, they had to cut it in half to fly it out of the remote area. If they had had a larger helicopter, the protein may have never been found. Although "no DNA from the ancient remains" could be recovered but "they did retrieve molecules of collagen." (Powell) "Dinosaur-ness of birds has been suspected for many years based on anatomical similarities, [and] new research is the first molecular evidence." (Powell) The scientists compared the protein found "with [twenty-one] living animals, including humans, chimps, mice, chickens, ostriches, alligators, and salmon," which confirmed chickens and ostriches were the closest relatives to the T. rex; and "to a lesser extent, alligators." (Bradt and Powell) The definite familial order is uncertain.
