

March is Demonstration Contest 4th & 5th Grades

~General Contest Rules~

- Time limit is 2-5 minutes. Points will be deducted for being over/under limit
- Individual demonstrations only, no teams. No audience participation. Do not use brands or labels. No live animals, babies, fireworks, weapons, or anything else banned or prohibited at school. If food is used, make sure there are no food allergies.
- Competition is by project/subject and not grade.
- Visual aid is REQUIRED but is limited to either 6 posters OR 6 slides (Power Point/Google). If using slides, they MUST be saved in a PDF format and mailed to your teacher BEFORE your classroom contest day! NO music, videos, special effects, or animations should be added to the slides. A projector will be provided.
- Computer/Technology Project may use additional technology, but it MUST relate to your presentation and be provided by you.



How to present a Demonstration Your Demonstration should include these three parts Introduction- Tell what you are demonstrating, and why it is important to you and your audience. Presentation- SHOW AND TELL ALL STEPS IN LOGICAL ORDER. Avoid prolonged silence. Personal experiences are good to refer to. Tell your source for any material and/or recipes. Tell what is being done and why throughout the demonstration. This will help avoid prolonged silences. Conclusion- Summarize your demonstration and give results. Repeat sources of information. Show the finished product attractively, make sure the entire audience sees it.

March is Interactive Exhibits 6th-8th Grades

- You have 1-2 Minutes to explain your exhibit, which should be displayed on a tri-fold board.
 Judges then have 2-3 minutes to ask questions.
- 1 point is deducted for every 30 seconds over time limit. If explanation is under 1 minute, 5 points are deducted.
- The exhibit should showcase knowledge gained, or a technique or skill learned.
- Any props used should support project display board.
- The word 4-H or the 4-H emblem should be somewhere on the exhibit.
- If technology is used, it is only a supplement to your visual and provides no auditory support. It does not replace your exhibit board.
- This is NOT a demonstration! Exhibit should relate to 4-H project work. It should be self explanatory.
- Competition is by project, not by grade. Competition ends at sub-region level.
- Interactive Exhibit should relate to one of the (29) 4-H Projects. Youth may only compete in one project area.
- Limit three youth per project/per county advance to the area-level contest,
- Each exhibitor will have 1/2 of a six-foot table. Free standing tri-fold boards should be used. Space from the table to the floor may be used.
- No live animals, babies, fireworks, weapons or anything banned or prohibited at school.
