February is Piggy Bank Pageant

Saving money can be fun! Here is a chance to show off your creative, artistic side and create your own piggy bank! Some items you might consider using for your bank might be milk cartons/jugs, plastic juice bottles, coffee cans, wood, or cardboard. **NO GLASS ALLOWED!** This contest is open to all 4th-12th graders. Classroom ribbon winners will move on to compete in the County Piggy Bank Pageant. Some County 1st place winners will move on to the State Piggy Bank Pageant, Have FUN and let's save some money!



~Banks **DO NOT** have to be in the shape of a pig or pig themed. Be creative!

FUN FACT: The term "Piggy Bank" is likely from the word "pygg" which referred to an orange colored clay that was used to make money containers in the Middle Ages. Over time, potters began creating these containers in the shape of a pig, leading to the term we use today!

~The bank **SHOULD NOT** exceed 12" tall x 12" wide x 12" deep. Make sure you measure!

~Banks **MUST HAVE** a way to **BOTH** put money **IN** and take money **OUT** without having to break the bank!

~Only 1 entry per 4-H'er

~Banks **MUST** be entirely created and decorated by the 4-H'er and sturdy enough to allow for transport without falling apart.

~You may decorate with paint, sequins, paper, stickers, fabric, felt, lace, etc...

~Label your bank somewhere with your **NAME, GRADE, HOMEROOM TEACHER, and SCHOOL**
Most importantly...HAVE FUN!!!

Who: Any 4th-8th Grade student in Giles County. We are looking to have participation from every school & grade.

What: Compete in a quiz bowl format with four (4) members, including you. Learn more about 4-H, Agriculture, Government, Life Skills, Science, & Tennessee.

1st Step: Form a team of four (4) students in the same grade as you from Giles County. The team can be made up of 4 students from the same homeroom, same school, or from any Giles County school.

2nd Step: (Optional) Ask a teacher or parent/guardian if they'd be interested in helping your team practice.

3rd Step: Study the 4-H Clover Bowl Manual for your grade and practice with your team.

4th Step: Compete at the county level contest in the spring (May).

5th Step: The 1st place team from each grade 4th-8th at the county contest will advance on to represent Giles County at the Central Region contest at Tennessee Tech University in Cookeville on **May 15, 2026**.
